Introduction

Parts of Wilton lie on a flood plain which may, in times of persistent rain, be affected by overflows from the rivers Nadder and Wylye. Flooding is caused by the volume of water in these rivers together with groundwater rising under residential and commercial properties.

Locations of properties that might be at risk, but are not limited to;

- Russell Street
- North Street, Riverside, Wylye Terrace, Churchill Court, Castle Lane, Crow Lane
- South Street
- Waterditchampton Road from the junction of the A30 to the riding stables
- Wilton Shopping Village

This Flood Plan is intended to provide assistance in the event of flooding, contact details of key personnel and recommendations on the procedures to follow, in the event of a flood warning.

REMEMBER!

It is the responsibility of the business owner and house-holder to protect their own property prior to a flood event occurring. They should make themselves aware of the current situation, including signing up for flood warning alerts.




