#### 119/19Town centre heritage signs

The Council has recently replaced the street name sign in Pennys Lane and this has met with favourable responses – the new format of the heritage blue signs bearing the Town crest has been well received. The Council may wish to consider adopting a programme of replacing the more prominent signs in the Town centre with the new format heritage signs – focusing on the historical streets in the first instance. The Council has £2,200 allocated in the current budget and could commission two further signs this year, leaving a contingency to cover a third if needed.

#### 120/19 Wilton Christmas Tree

Works are scheduled for Friday 22nd November. The tree surgeons will also inspect the fixing for the Christmas star and secure it if required. The Christmas lights are due to be erected on Monday 25th November.

#### 122/19 Castle Meadow: Fencing

There are now two football teams using the Castle Meadow pitch for their home games – Barford Hornets and Porton Juniors. The teams have raised the issue of balls going into the river behind the goal at the Flouse Hole end of the ground. The teams have asked if the fencing can be raised. To raise the height of the fence along the river will be expensive and is not considered to represent good value for money. An alternative, previously made available by the Council, was the provision of an extendable 'fishing' net that enables teams to retrieve balls that get into the river. The old net was broken several years ago replacement would cost only £50.

#### 123/19 Wilton Town Council Budget 2020/21

- Public Conveniences (facelift) (£7,500)
- Flouse Hole & Biodiversity (£5,000)
- Water bottle refill station (£1,500)
- Garden of Remembrance (£1,000)
- Dementia Café (£750)
- Disabled Access CATG match funding for dropped kerbs and footway improvements (£5,000)
- Replacement artificial cricket wicket (£7,000)
- Flood fund (£1,500)

The Committee is asked to prioritise this list and pass its proposals to the Budget Working Party, in order that a draft budget may be submitted to the Full Council for adoption.
