The current SID is being deployed at 4 locations in the Town, in rotation. The data indicates that speeding is evident at all three locations that have been activated so far, The Avenue, South Street (Oak Ash Green) and Burcombe Lane.

The Avenue is by far the worst location, both in terms of number of vehicles and percentage that are speeding.

The collected data are being submitted to and have been approved by Wiltshire Police. This data is used to inform Police Force Deployment for speed enforcement activities.

The current SID unit is powered by two Lead Acid batteries which only last about one week on The Avenue, just over two weeks at South Street (Oak Ash Green) and about three weeks at Burcombe Lane.

The SID Volunteer Group would like to see a SID deployed on The Avenue for much longer periods than currently scheduled and this could be achieved by the purchase of a second SID unit.
