Any items for the April list need to be sent to the Assistant Clerk **before** Monday 17th April Below is a list of what he can be asked to do, they need to be prioritized.

Hand clearing and cutting of growth from drainage grips and drain gully covers

Hand clearing of blocked drainage gullies, grips, culverts, pipes and pits (unable to jet system)

Clearing storm debris from the roads and footways

Pedestrian barriers preparation and painting

Cleaning and straightening of small road signs, street nameplates and bollards

Securing of existing small road signs, verge marker posts and supplied street name plates

Removal of limited graffiti from road signs, bollards and street nameplates

Hand cutting of grass and vegetation in visibility areas

Hand treatment of weeds

Hand clearance of encroaching growth and soils from footways

Repair of small potholes in roads and on footways

Grounds maintenance The monthly meetings with the contractor and clerk are continuing. The benches at Minster St have been installed.

The edging at the Cemetery will be started soon as well as weedkilling of the paths and new gravel. Grass cutting starts officially next week although some has already been done.

Cemetery Interments and burials continue with Mr Matthews representing the Council.

Report received of tap not working, it seems the stopcock had been turned off – it is not known by who as this is inside the building (which is alarmed).

Speed Indicator Device. This is now in use, currently displayed at The Avenue.

Public Toilets. The timer has been replaced.

Minster Street cycle path - No further update.

Tennis Courts – these will be unlocked on 31st March, the issue with the ramp access remains an issue and we are trying to get it resolved.
