Project Title	Wilton Intergenerational Heritage Arts Project
Project Summary	Working with a range of organisations including Wiltshire Youth Action and Entrain the newly formed Fugglestone St Peter Trust will facilitate a series of intergenerational workshops involving young people from Wilton, older residents and veterans. Through reminiscence and recorded oral history everyone will be invited to tell their stories which will then be collated and created into a medieval themed large scale performance reflecting the heritage of Wilton and of people's personal experiences. The project will be an opportunity for local amateur and professional actors and musicians of all ages to take part in a performance that everyone

4 PROJECT DETAIL

Tell us about your project Including your aims and objectives and who will benefit

St Peter's Church, Fugglestone is one of the oldest and most iconic buildings in Wilton and unites the old and new parts of our town. There is now a heritage project to repair and adapt this severely underused medieval church into a joint place of worship/community facility and community consultation already undertaken has indicated strong support for arts and music forming a core part of the building's new role. The trustees of the recently formed Fugglestone St Peter Trust are keen to build on that support through a theatre based performance project involving local people of all ages. The project will interweave medieval history with the stories and lived experiences of current residents including older people from St John's Almshouses, local children and recent veterans housed at Wilton Hill.

The project will be developed through a series of eight intergenerational workshops (running through late 2025/spring 2026) concentrating on reminiscence and oral history and designed by highly respected theatre director and trustee Sam Holland – Bunyan. Then in collaboration with the local history group all the stories will be collated into a dramatic large scale free performance (scheduled for the summer of 2026) across two sites including St Peter's, to be enjoyed by the whole town. Recruiting volunteers for the project would be through local mainstream and social media and in consultation with amongst others; Wilton School, Wilton Scouts and Youth Group, Entrain Veterans, Wilton Men's Shed, the Wednesday Club and through the wider Fugglestone St Peter supporter base.

Re: Proposal for additional containers at Castle Meadow

It is proposed by Wilton Men's Shed and Wilton Carnival to seek permission from Wilton Town Council to re orientate the existing 2 council containers by 90 degrees in a clockwise direction; and to provide 2 additional ones for the Carnival/Community and the Men's Shed.

The works involved would require a new concrete pad approx. 4 meters x 7.5 meters to be laid adjacent to the Mens Shed and meeting up with the existing pad.

The groundworks would also include removing excess material and the levelling of the compound to allow easy access to all the containers.

The costs are as follows:-

1 x digger for a day
1 x grab lorry to remove spoil
2 x Gubic Metres concrete
3 x Hi-Ab hire to reorientate containers
2 x New containers including delivery

Scope of Work Wilton Cemetery Gatehouse remedial works

Location: Wilton Cemetery Gatehouse, Shaftesbury Road, Wilton, Nr Salisbury, Wilts SP2 0DU

The scope of works is based on a Structural Survey (May 2024) – available upon request

1. Structural Repairs

- Install 16mm diameter tie bar through courtyard at high level.
- Fit with 2 decorative pattress plates (design to be agreed with client).

2. Chimney Works

- - Erect two-lift access scaffold around chimneys.
- Carefully dismantle existing chimney stacks.
- Sort and clean salvaged bricks and decorative corbels.
- - Rebuild chimneys to original specification using reclaimed bricks.
- Install new lead trays and flashings.
- Remove all debris and waste from site.
- - Note: If corbels are damaged during removal, replacements will be sourced at additional cost.

3. Roofing and Drainage

- Remove existing lead flashing.
- Install new Code 4 lead flashings.
- - Excavate pathway area and connect downpipe to main soakaway drain.
- Inspect and repair slipped tiles and battens (if required).

4. Damp and Vegetation Control

- - Remove all ivy from south elevation.
- Apply treatment to prevent regrowth.
- Address damp patch in waiting area via chimney repairs and improved flashing.

5. Internal Ceiling Repairs

- - Supply and erect access tower.
- - Overboard approximately 4m² of ceiling above fireplace in chapel.
- - Apply skim coat plaster over newly boarded area.
- - Alternative Option: Remove all lathe and plaster and install plasterboard ceiling.

6. Groundworks

- - Remove approximately 2m² of paving.
- Fill sunken areas with lean-mix concrete and compact.
- Reinstate cobbled/paved surface to match existing finish.

7. Optional / Further Investigation

• - Further investigation may be required for woodwork or hidden structural elements not covered in the visual survey.

DESCRIPTION

Chimneys

- Safe erection and dismantling of a two-lift access scaffold around the chimneys
- Careful removal of the existing chimney stack, sorting and cleaning salvaged bricks and decorative corbels
- Rebuilding the chimney to its original specification, including new reclaimed bricks to replace where needed and installation of a new lead tray.

Removal of all debris and waste materials from site.

£18,780.00

Please note: The quote is based on the assumption that the decorative corbels can be removed and reused without being damaged. If they are found to be damaged during the demolition stage, then new ones would need to be sourced and fitted at an agreed additional cost.

- Supply and erect access tower.
- Overboard area of ceiling above fire place in chapel (approximately 4m2)
- Skim coat plaster over newly boarded area.
