- B. Questioned the accessibility of the toilets in the Council Foyer.
- C. Could a Focus Group be set up for these accessibility issues?
- D. In 2023 there were two accessibility audits. What is happening as a result?
- E. When the castle Meadow Gates are shut there is no suitable pedestrian access.
- F. Could a QR code be set up for Pavilion hire together with the phone number?
- G. The notice boards heights are not suitable for wheelchair users.

- H. There should be more Wilton Town Council advertising on Wilton Chat FB.
- I. Could the Wilton Town Council Website be more user friendly?
- J. Parishioners should be more involved in organising community activities for parishioners.

Council Responses given at the meeting:

- A. Those present were not aware of the exact reason but suggested this was probably a legacy notice.

- B. This was due to be addressed in conjunction with the Chamber access issue.
- C. Did not have a problem with this proposal.
- D. This would be examined in a forward plan for the Town Council.
- E. Understand the issue over the muddy, tree rooted present access. Perhaps can be considered in the Car Park project that was still in hand.
- F. Did not have a problem with this proposal.
- G. The boards were installed to the manufacturer's specifications.
- H. Did not have a problem with this proposal.
- I. Did not have a problem with this proposal.
- J. This seemed to be similar to the Town Team arrangement from earlier years, that was not continued
